<u>Psalms 143:8</u>

⁸ Let the morning bring me word of your unfailing love for I have put my trust in you. Show me the way I should go, for to you I entrust my life.



The reading begins with the phrase "Let the morning bring me word of your unfailing love", a timely reminder that every day when we wake up, God greets us with his love. His love is unconditional and it doesn't ever stop. Some mornings when we wake up, we may feel a bit groggy, maybe even a bit tired. But this verse reminds us that no matter how we're feeling God's love is still there to greet us. It continues, and mentions how we put our lives in the hands of God and how we trust in him. For people who don't regard themselves as 'Christians' this may be confusing, but a cool way to think about this from a non-Christian perspective is to look at the classroom. When you were young you entrusted your teacher. In primary school, you saw your teacher as the fountain of knowledge. Now as you got older and went to high school you began thinking for yourself a little bit. You still saw your teachers as mentors and you still trusted them, but now you were also able to research and learn for yourself. Our walk with Christ is similar. In fact, Jesus was referred to as Rabbi in the Bible which actually translates to Teacher. As Christians, we place our trust in Jesus and we rely on Him. As we grow, our thinking evolves and changes, but our trust and hope continues to stay on Jesus.



- 1. The verse mentions placing your trust in Christ. What are some areas in your life currently that you can place you trust in Christ?
- 2. Your friend who has no interest in Religion at all is struggling through depression and confides in you. As a Christian you have experienced the love that Christ bestows and believe that Christ can comfort your friend. How would you go about revealing God's love to them?

<u>Or</u>

As someone who doesn't regard themselves as a Christian or someone who is new to faith, do you think that it is important to place your trust in a higher power? Why, why not?

3. An important factor in growing or establishing your trust in Christ is through prayer. We encourage you to think of the areas in your life that need prayer, they can be anything. I was once told that there is no prayer that God won't listen to. With this in mind, after you've figured out the areas in your life that you want to pray for, we encourage you to spend some time now in prayer. If this is your first time praying, just remember prayer is simply a conversation with God. Don't complicate it and don't be afraid. God loves you and wants to spend time with you.



We hope you enjoyed our first day together, as the week goes on, we'll slowly explore more verses, but we felt as though this was a good warm up for our first devotional together. Romans 12:9 – 10

⁹ Love must be sincere. Hate what is evil; cling to what is good. ¹⁰ Be devoted to one another in love. Honour one another above yourselves.



The book of Romans was written by the Apostle Paul as a letter to the Romans. From the verses 9-10 we're able to see what Paul is asking the Romans to value. He says "Love must be SINCERE." In other words, it must come from the heart. "Hate what is EVIL." We all know right from wrong. We all know what we should do and when we do things that we know are wrong, we get a weird feeling in our stomach. What Paul is saying is that we need to identify the wrong things in life and steer clear of it. "CLING TO WHAT IS GOOD." There are certain things in your life that make you happy and help you feel connected to God. It may be listening to music, being active, or reading your Bible. Paul's words here are so applicable to our lives today. He is saying that in all the chaos and in all the uncertainty, stick to what you know is good and what makes you happy. Paul goes on to stay, "Be devoted to one another in love. Honour one another above yourselves." Paul is telling us that we need to take care of our own. Support each other in the faith, and you will find that your own faith will be strengthened. Our communities around us need Jesus and our families need him too. Pauls reminder is for us to be intentional with the people around us and to love them and to be the light that Jesus is to the people in our daily lives.

Colossians 3:12-14

¹² Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience. ¹³ Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you. ¹⁴ And over all these virtues put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity.



This verse is once again written by the Apostle Paul, and the book of Colossians is his letter to the church of Colossae. This is Paul reminding the Colossian church what to value and what to hold dear. He calls us "God's chosen people," meaning that we all have purpose and that he designed us for a reason. The verse goes on to list all these amazing qualities which are good to have, but if you read them carefully, they're all the important qualities to have when socialising with other people. It reminds us to forgive each other and to work with each other in any situation. We all know how hard it is to forgive each other but Paul is telling us that we need to forgive each other and then uses God as an example of how to forgive people.

He then states arguably the most important bit, which is; "And over all these virtues put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity". This is Paul reminding us that out of everything that's going on in our lives we must always have love for each other, and we must place that above everything else. This can be the hardest thing ever! I know personally it can be very hard to love people. But what Paul is telling us is that if God sees what we do every day and he knows what we think and still continues to love us unconditionally then we can do the same to the people around us.
